


Strawberry Farms Civic Chatter

Landscaping & Beautification

The traffic islands you find along Strawberry Farms Blvd., Wintergreen Blvd., Forest Edge and Magnolia Blossom were installed by the City of Columbus, although the city did not designate any funds or labor to maintain them. These traffic islands can either be eyesores, or beautiful landmarks. Some neighbors have generously adopted a traffic island near their home, weeding and planting the area.

In other cases, such as near the neighborhood entrance at 161, there are no nearby homes and volunteers from our Civic Association work to maintain them. We are increasing our partnerships with the apartment management companies to assist us.

Did you know the Alum Creek Trail bike path that runs through Strawberry Farms Park goes all the way north through Westerville to Sunbury, and south to Easton, to Innis Park and on toward Nelson Road and the near east side, then southeast to Three Creeks Metro Park and Pickerington Ponds!

Our park features a playground with two sections, a basketball court, picnic tables and a

shelter, a large field, and access to the path for walking, biking, running, skating, etc.
